If we want children to achieve good results and master learning a foreign language, it would be desirable for foreign language teachers in their work to use an interactive approach to learning as much as possible, which is especially suitable for children with developmental difficulties.

The Akelius digital platform for learning foreign languages in selected schools of the Una-Sana Canton, which uses an interactive method, has proven to be useful and contribute to an easier learning process for children with developmental disabilities.

"With the Akelius platform for learning foreign languages, we usually work in groups on tablets and children with developmental difficulties feel like part of that group.

Very often they do not need help, and demonstrate better knowledge than through a traditional learning approach.

I noticed that students with developmental difficulties prefer to use media such as tablets that are available through the Akelius digital platform because they also use them at home," explains the German language teacher Nihada Kahrić from Elementary School "Gornje Prekounje - Ripač" in Bihać.

Students with developmental difficulties accept the Akelius platform for learning foreign languages very well because the program allows them to focus better.

This platform gives them the opportunity to be individual at the same time, but also to be part of a team, thus strengthening their capacities.
