Education is a right for all. But this slogan is meaningless when you see many children of school age hanging out in the streets of Nouakchott.

In the preamble of the policy letter of the education and training sector 2022 - 2032, it is stated that education is a sectoral priority of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania. This desire of the

public authorities would have been reflected over the last twenty years in the development of several national programs for the development of the education system (PNDSE I and II).

However, in view of the national and international commitments that Mauritania has made to guarantee inclusive and quality education throughout life throughout its territory, the challenges remain numerous, especially with a view to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals in education (SDG 4) by 2030. Improvements in the quality of learning and the development of young people's skills are major issues, as well as the reduction of gender inequalities that persist as the school career

progresses and remain marked in rural areas and in the poorest wilayas. In Nouakchott there are more school losses in the wilaya of Nouakchott-sud; the most populous wilaya in the capital.

School loss

Among the main causes that caught our attention, we note the family problem, socio-economic status, the environment where children live, school difficulties and school repetition. Each of these bad situations can become a major cause of school dropout. A dropout student is likely to suffer a whole series of negative consequences, including psychological and mental problems, as well as behavioral problems. In addition, he is more likely to be socially isolated and suffer from depression.

School loss is also one of the main causes of the presence of many children on the labor market and on the streets in Nouakchott and in the country's major cities.

The AED/AKELIUS center: a relief for parents and children out of school or out of school

Created on June 16, 2006 in order to contribute differently to the development of communities. The NGO/AED (Assistance-Education) initiates and implements local development projects in several areas, such as child education and protection, food and nutrition security, environmental protection or the promotion of access to basic social services (water, sanitation, waste management, etc.) throughout the Wilayas of Mauritania.

In Nouakchott, the NGO AED, in partnership with UNICEF and the AKELIUS Foundation, has a center in Arafat for the training, integration and reintegration of out-of-school or out-of-school children. This center has, among other objectives:

To work, in accordance with AED's objectives, to protect the child by:

The recovery and reintegration of out-of-school or out-of-school children

Training to give another chance to children from the most vulnerable strata

The use of the latest pedagogical techniques for better and rapid reintegration through the Akelius approach.

More than 430 children who did not go to school or who dropped out, were inserted into different schools in Arafat between 2019 and 2023.

If the NGO/AED was able to obtain these results, it is thanks to the support of its financial partners, including the Akelius Foundation, UNICEF, as well as the good collaboration with the Ministry of Education through the regional directorate of education of the wilaya of Nouakchott-sud.

However, these children face a major problem, namely that of civil status. Indeed, more than half of the children do not have a birth certificate. This means that even re-entered in the public school, they are not in a regular situation and will not be able to participate in the national exams.

Hope would be allowed for these hundreds of children, following the decree of the Minister of the Interior and Decentralization establishing commissions in all the wilayas of the country to proceed with the enlistment of citizens without civil status documents.
